

### "WHAT HAVE YOU TO DO WITH US, JESUS OF NAZARETH?" (Mark 1:24)



Could a demon-possessed man be asking a question that we also ask? We may not want to admit it, but it is nonetheless true.

As I was preparing to write this monthly reflection, there were, admittedly, two other things on my mind. The annual Augustana District Theological Conference will soon occur under the theme, "Lutheran Pastors for Changing Times." Pastors and congregations face

unique challenges, some of which we hope to address at this year's conference. Preaching the gospel is a bold and daring exercise in a time like ours.

Also on my mind was the Gospel text for January 28, Mark 1:21-28. There Jesus enters the synagogue and is confronted by a possessed man who asks this question, "WHAT HAVE YOU TO DO WITH US, JESUS OF NAZA-RETH?" The demon knows the answer. Jesus has everything to do with him. Jesus is a threat and the demon knows his time is up. Even the religious experts knew there was something different with Jesus present. They were amazed and stunned by what they saw and sensed in Jesus.

The demon's question is our question also. The truth is, Jesus has everything to do with us. Without our asking or invitation, he has decided to get his life all tangled up with ours. It is a take-over. There is no question about that. This comes as a threat to our wills before it can ever be received as the promise of His grace.

Flannery O'Connor was a gifted author and theologian, who died far too early. She was masterful at describing Jesus' power and authority in much the same way as the possessed man. She has much to say in a time such as ours. Lamenting the "state of religion," she once put it this way:

"One of the effects of modern (theology) has been gradually to turn religion into poetry and therapy, to make truth vaguer and vaguer and more and more relative, to banish intellectual distinctions, to depend on feeling instead of thought, and gradually to come to believe that God has no power, that he cannot communicate with us, cannot reveal himself to us, indeed has not done so, and that religion is our own sweet invention."

Jesus has everything to do with us. "No strength of ours can match his might," Luther wrote. "It is no longer I who lives, but Christ who lives in me," declared St. Paul. (Galatians 2:20) The idea that Jesus is simply a sunny addition to our already nice lives overlooks a most important fact about the human heart. If the human heart is indeed "a factory of idols," sinners will always resist God and create idols to believe in and hang onto. This means that, as sinners, we resist God and create idols to believe in and hang onto. But God has sent his Son to do something about this. In fact, He has come to take over our lives, by dethroning anything or anyone we fear, love or trust more than God. Could there be any better news than that?

"What do you have to do with us, Jesus of Nazareth?" Thank God, the answer is "Everything!"
