

#### What is the Purpose of Districts?

I recently returned from the annual gathering of LCMC District/Fellowship Coordinators. It is always a good time of renewal, sharing resources, and conversation about LCMC and its mission. As we think about the current and future direction of LCMC, at the heart of it lies the role of districts. Districts have always been a part of the vision behind LCMC, but frankly, many congregations have not yet caught that vision. As I think about the "Why Districts?" question, three things come to mind.

#### 1. Districts can strengthen LCMC as an association of congregations.

LCMC's by-laws put it this way: 5.01. Congregations, in their sole discretion, may join together in districts and shall adopt governing documents, budgets and other procedures that will allow districts to support the mission of the members of this association. 5.03. Districts shall have such powers to promote and accomplish the objectives of this association that are specifically granted to those districts by member congregations and not otherwise prohibited by these by-laws or the constitution of this association.Written into the LCMC by-laws is the idea that districts give focus and support to the association.

# 2. Districts can give traction and clarity to the LCMC "motto:" Free in Christ. Accountable to One Another. Rooted in the Scriptures and the Lutheran Confession. Working together to fulfill Christ's Great Commission.

Districts, as well as congregations, need to ask what this actually means. When we say we are "Free in Christ," what are the distinctions between individual freedom in Christ, congregational freedom in Christ, district freedom in Christ, association freedom in Christ? When we say that we are "Accountable to one another," how do we organize in a way that can insure a level of integrity for churches, pastors and leaders in LCMC? We are "Rooted in the Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions," but what does "theological accountability" mean? Churches are uniquely called to "Work together to fulfill Christ's Great Commission to go and make disciples of all nations," but how does clarity about the first three points help serve the most important one called the Great Commission?

#### 3. Districts can address future needs within LCMC.

What will serve to further the work of this association called LCMC? What parts of that work could best be carried out by districts? The Augustana District has accomplished much in its short tenure. I think this is because we have clarity about our purpose and call. But there are so many more possibilities that could be addressed by districts (ours or others). We are all concerned about future pastors, teachers and leaders within LCMC. I wonder how the role of LCMC on college campuses and through Bible camps might address this concern and need? This is certainly an area that could be strengthened by LCMC districts. I would encourage all of us to ask the "Why Districts?" question as we strive to answer God's call in this time and place. I would be thrilled to know your thoughts. Thank you for this partnership!

Thoughts from Pastor Paul, Chairperson of the Board Of World Missions


Clearly there are legitimate questions about what is visionary and what is prudent in how
