## Going Global for Christ!

The Augustana District's Board of World Missions presented two World Missions Festivals: one at Abounding Joy Lutheran Church in Sartell, Minnesota, on January 21, and another at Hosanna Lutheran Church in Watertown, South Dakota, on February 4.

Featured speaker for the events was Professor Paul Martinson. Born in China, Martinson is a third-generation missionary to China. He gave a compelling presentation about

why we, as Christians, are called to spread the Gospel around the world. Paul and his wife, Ida, served as missionaries in China in the 1960s. After that, Paul served as Professor of Missions and Religions at Luther Seminary in St. Paul for 29 years. In his retirement, he has helped develop China Service Ventures, which, among other things, provides Christian Youth Camps in China, along with Bible distribution and teaching English as a second language. Chair of the Board of World Missions – Pastor Paul Knudson – also gave a meaty and insightful presentation entitled, "Opportunities and Challenges for Our Mission Witness." As we participate in the reconfiguring of the Lutheran witness, Knudson noted five opportunities before us:



Mission endeavors must grow out of our core convictions.

- We need to create partnerships with existing mission endeavors that share our core convictions.
- From the grassroots, we need to create large and small networks of support for world missions. This means individual congregations need freedom to forge their own initiatives and to form congregations who work together.
- To have the Augustana District become a catalyst for cooperative work with LCMC, NALC and others in world mission endeavors.
- To encourage every congregation to have a Missions Committee to focus energy and resources on world missions.

As a member of a joint LCMC / NALC / EECMY (Ethiopian Evangelical Church Mekane Yesus) task force, Knudson shared that this new group has begun work to explore how these church bodies can help, share and support one another. Like the Augustana District, the EECMY severed its ties with the ELCA. It is important that LCMC and NALC "step in" to assist and partner with our Lutheran brothers and sisters in Ethiopia. A key player in this endeavor is the Rev. Dr. Gemechis Buba, a

# Theological Conference:

## "The Meaning and Means of Conversion"

While organizers had hoped for 40 participants, over 70 pastors attended the first annual Theological Conference

of the Augustana District the Institute Lutheran Theology. The event was held at the Place Hyatt Bloomington, Minnesota, from February 5-8 under the theme "The Meaning a n d Means Conversion." Attendees came from around the country and included numerous Augustana District pastors, other LCMC pastors pastors of the NALC and ELCA.

## Summary of the Conference

Hans Hillerbrand, kicked off the event with a thorough examination of conversions throughout the history of Christianity. He was followed by Dr. Steven Paulson of Luther Seminary, who gave a resounding presentation on conversion from a confessional Lutheran perspective.

Dr. Dennis Bielfeldt, from the Institute of Lutheran theology, followed with his reactions to the previous presentations, as well as offering a scholarly argument from a theological/philosophical point of view.

#### Lutheran Evangelism Initiative (LEI)

Participants were given a new congregation-ally-based evangelism program written by Dr. Fred Baltz, president of ILT and pastor of St. Matthew Lutheran Church in Galena, Illinois. LEI is a reworking of a very effective program used by the ELC, then the ALC as well as other church bodies. This program is available on the Augustana District website, and the District's

Board of Domestic Missions is available and eager to assist any congregations that would like to embrace it.

The conference was also blessed with a presentation given by Pastors Kelly Wasberg and David Christensen from Living Word Lutheran Church in Marshall, Minnesota. Living Word is among the fastest growing congregations in LCMC, and is deeply invested in campus ministry at nearby Southwest Minnesota State University.

#### **Reflections on the Conference**

When asked why the Augustana District considers Theological Conferences to be an important component of what the District provides, Pastor Randy Freund (Faith Lutheran, Hutchinson, Minnesota), who is chair of the Augustana District Council replied, "I think of the Augustana District as a District of LCMC that works hard to promote theological integrity, competence and creativity along with congregational support and services. Therefore it is so important for pastors to come together to be fed theologically and find support through fellowship. This helps create strong pastoral leadership. When we come together for a conference like this, it also gives us a better sense of what

congregations need by way of support and service."

I L T Vice President, Dennis Bielfeldt, had this to offer regarding theological conferences: "ILT is, of course, a very young institution, having

acquired its own non-profit corporation status and its 501(c)(3) at the beginning of 2008. However, ILT theological conferences have occurred each year, so this was ILT's fifth annual theological conference. We have had numerous speakers over the years, including Hans Hillerbrand, Mark Granquist, Andy Bartelt, Steve Paulson, Jim Nestingen, Charles Manske and Dennis Bielfeldt. ILT is pleased to work with the Augustana District in co-sponsoring what we hope to be a yearly ILT/AD Theological conference."

#### **LCMC Mission Forum**



### Time on Your Knees

A Meditation by Pastor Becky Hand Life in Grace LC, Odessa, TX

"I appeal to you therefore, brothers and sisters, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies as a living sacrifice, holy and



It's all about change... isn't it? Being transformed... it is. Christ changes us, "converts" us, if you will. The Word does a job on us. Sometimes it feels a bit painful, sometimes overwhelmingly joyful, and sometimes we don't even notice it. Jesus Christ changes us in big ways and in little ways, but always in God-ways. The Theological Conference in February addressed the Lutheran version of "Conversion," the radical change from death to life that happens through our baptism, the change that God makes in us. God changes us because we cannot change ourselves. Thank God for... well... for being God.

In our daily repentance and drowning of the old Adam or Eve, we re-celebrate our conversion. The new self rises as the old self dies. Unfortunately, we like dragging our old drown self around with us. Well, the "wet look" really isn't "in" anymore. Can't we rid ourselves of some of the stuff that old Eve or Adam refuses to give up?

One day I was struggling to download an updated program on the computer that I needed for classes at ILT. I attempted this "simple" feat several times over in as many days. I emailed the tech person a few times. I'm sure he rolls his eyes when he sees my pleas of ignorance. If he doesn't, he should. I do. At any rate, I decided to use the troubleshooting link to get some help. After going around in a couple of circles there, I finally decided to take a shot at one of the suggestions. The problem *could* be, as the list of potential problems informed me, that I needed to uninstall the current program, then I could install the new version, the 10.1021.2354.1546 whatever version. In light of this new revelation, I hope that you'll speak with your designer soon, transformation *can* be yours! Point out that you have some old worn-out feelings and left-over pains that you're ready to uninstall. Ask him to remove that stuff from you and to keep it away from you forever. The lover of your soul is ready to install a happier, more peaceful, more generous and loving you. You don't even need an email address or a 4G network. A little time on your knees will do it.
