At the April meeting of the Augustana District Council, there was a good feeling around the table (and on the "Zoom" screen). As a district, we ended the year in a strong financial position. This gave encouragement for setting next year's budget and allowed us to move forward on some other giving (see Council Highlights). We should not be surprised by this. We have a gracious, giving God. This makes for a giving people of God.

But one wonders if it would lso be accurate to say that we have a "taking" God. Of course, on the surface, this could sound ridiculous and even heretical. It seems to fly in the face of that most basic and beloved Bible verse, John 3:16: "God so loved the world that He gave..."

However, one could also faithfully argue that we have a "taking" God. God takes in all kinds of ways. God takes our sins upon himself. This was certainly a part of our recent Good Friday/Easter proclamations. But we can extend that to other ways of taking. God takes our situations. Once God takes them, He changes and transforms them. Think of Peter and his bitter weeping from his denial. Jesus takes that situation and turns it. In fact, according to Mark's gospel, it is the first Easter words we hear. "Go tell the disciples, even Peter, that I am going before you..." (Mark 16:8). Jesus even takes our lives. We die to self. "It is no longer I who live but Christ who lives in me". (Galatians 2:20). Anything good or giving that comes OUT of us comes only because God has taken us INTO himself. God has taken us over.

So while we will rightly go on speaking of God as a giving God, we would do well Iso to see God as a taking God. God takes our sin, our situations and our very lives. God even takes over and owns LCMC districts. Like you, I certainly give thanks to God for the direction He is taking our district!

The Augustana District fiscal year ends well! Congregational and individual giving was up \$5,000 from last year. The fiscal year ended with a surplus of \$21,427. Because of this good news...

- 2. The District Council established three Chapter Challenge Grants (up to \$5,000/grant)


