### What is the Peace of God?

 ${
m W}$  hat is the Peace of God?

"In the world, you will have tribulation....in me.... peace." (John 16:33)

In Christ Jesus, there is peace in tribulation. This is the tension of the life of faith in this world.

Tribulation and peace walk together, side by side.

What does this look like? How do the cross and resurrection of Christ define and shape this?

### $\overline{\mathbf{W}}$ hat is the peace of God?

The peace of God is CONFIDENCE in God. It is so sure of God's overriding and reliable faithfulness that it trusts God. The confidence of peace comes despite what one sees or senses or feels around him or her. It is confidence in the midst of real and present tribulation.

### $\overline{\mathbf{W}}$ hat is the peace of God?

It is a POWER that keeps us and guards us. We hear this in St. Paul's famous benediction.

"Now may the peace of God which passes all understanding, keep and guard your heart and minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:7)

The peace of God is a power that guards and keeps us in Christ, especially when we are vulnerable or feel separated from him.

 $\mathbf{W}$  hat is the peace of God?

It is Jesus' PROMISE contained in, by and through His Word:

"I have said these things to you, that in me you may have peace." (John 16:33) Jesus promises to come to us and to meet us at the point of our greatest needs. He comes to complete all that is incomplete and empty in our lives.

### $oldsymbol{W}$ hat is the peace of God?

It is the promised HOLY SPIRIT. In his farewell discourse, Jesus prepared his followers for his departure. Knowing what lay ahead for them, he promised to send the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, to give that peace which passes understanding.

### $\overline{\mathbf{W}}$ hat is the peace of God?

It is COURAGE to take heart and to be still and know that Jesus is our Lord and God in any and all circumstances, and through any hardship. Why can we trust this to be true? Because this is a peace that is anchored in the final promise of John 16:

### "I have conquered the world!"

So may this peace of God which passes all human understanding, keep and guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus!

### Coming July 2, 2019... Lutheran Quarterly Book Series

Coming July 2, 2019 in the Lutheran Quarterly Books series, *The Essential Forde: Distinguishing* Law and Gospel. It is basically Forde's greatest hits. The difference from the previous two Lutheran

Quarterly Books collections of Forde's work is that this volume largely contains excerpts from his books. The first chapter is from The Law-Gospel Debate. Then On Being a Theologian of the Cross and Theology Is for Proclamation play a starring role, with The Captivation of the Will also making an appearance.

I would recommend Where God Meets Man: Luther's Down-to-Earth Ap-proach to the Gospel as an introduction to Forde for lay people and The Essential Forde for college/ seminary students (and for quite interested lay people). The latter has a short preface

by James Nestingen and a Forde biography in nuce. Then Mark Mattes introduces the excerpts in the book and Steven Paulson gives 20 pages of his usual explosions, including a couple of great lines from Forde's teaching. "The editors have produced a helpful sample of significant studies from the pen of the most insightful North American interpreter of


Luther in the latter decades of the twentieth century. Readers experience the master of the phrase well-turned on Luther's lathe from a number of Forde's writings. The personal reflections and ruminations

of the editors prepare readers for venturing into the depths of Forde's imaginative contemporary translation of the heart of the proclamation of Christ in the works of the Wittenberg Reformer. Here, readers learn how the law kills both nomian and antinomian attempts to turn away from the crucified and risen Christ's freely given gift of new life and what it means to live as a righteous child of God through daily repentance and the forgiveness of sins." We are encouraging all AD Congregations to have an Augustana District Sunday.


On that day we ask you to take 3 minutes to share the video with your congregation.


Pastor Julie Smith Julie Smith is a pastor at St. Johns

What's Caching?


For load time reduction, a lot of computers will cache (store a snapshot of) pages and show you outdated information.

Or simply ask a search engine for your specific device, and it will show you how to clear your specific device cache.






