BIBLE STUDY DEVOTIONAL

At the District Convention on Saturday, September 26, we will have two Bible study sessions focusing on John chapter 20. These sessions will be led by pastor Julie Smith and pastor Nathan Hanson. Below you will find a brief description of the focus of their studies.

Seeing is believing? Touching is believing?

"I'll believe it when I see it." We have all heard that expression.

Perhaps we have even said it. But when we stop and think about it, it makes no sense at all. If you see, there is no need to believe. If you believe, you do not need to see. Faith and sight are not the same thing. They are very nearly opposites.

Our Bible studies at the District Convention will focus on John chapter 20. This chapter is comprised of the first Easter appearances of Jesus. Mary sees Jesus. Ten of the disciples see Jesus. Eventually Thomas sees Jesus. But none of them know what to make of their seeing because what they are seeing is something they cannot be seeing. They already saw Jesus dead. They cannot now be seeing him alive. That's not how things work.

If we read these accounts a little more carefully, we will notice that, even though their focus is on what they've seen, the difference maker is actually what they hear. The difference maker is the Word spoken to them, the Word speaking to them.

Our convention theme is 2020 Vision. We will have many opportunities to see where our Savior is at work in the world and in our congregations. We will gather around a vision for what the Augustana District is called to be and do in the coming years. But as with any gathering of the people of God, at the center of it all will not be a sight but a sound.

The Word is what feeds our faith, fuels our mission. The Word is calling this community together. Anchored in that Word we are set on a mission to bear witness to the life we have in Jesus' name – a witness that will be a blessing to others who have not seen, but will yet come to believe.

BIBLE STUDY DEVOTIONAL

An Old and Familiar Story?

Here we have an old story of the faith, maybe third behind the Christmas story and the first session of scripture scrutinized by believers and agnostics alike, the account of Thomas missing the party of Jesus' appearance to the gang. It begins with a "Silent Slip" and goes out with a "Shout!"

As you might suspect, there are twists and turns to the study of this passage, but we needn't make more of it than what it really says. If you are anything like the Christian I am, you will find surprises in those things the Bible says about this event, and what it does not say about what we study.

There will be some comparisons with various

translations, all of them in English. (I know very little Norwegian, but I can say "Thank you" and ask directions to the train station.)

This will be a brief study, more inclusive of questions than answers, because that seems to be my strength. It would be helpful if you were to have read the passages to each of these studies before they are presented, but as we are Lutherans saved by grace, this is hardly a demand. Do pray for our convention and for the sites, and their presenters, and prepare for a great (though Covid-inhibited) time "together as best we can gather."

2020 Initiative

WHAT IS LCMC 3.0?

"LCMC 3.0" is popping up in recent communications from the association. What does it mean and why does it matter to the Augustana District? As a member of the LCMC Board of Trustees and Service Coordinator of the District, it seemed important to say something about this.

The simple explanation is that the LCMC Board of Trustees has now selected its third Service Coordinator, Pastor Mike Bradley. LCMC 3.0 indicates a new direction with a new Service Coordinator.

However, it is more complicated than this. When it was clear that Pastor Mark Vander Tuig was to retire, LCMC hired a consultant to review and evaluate the status of the association. This consultant made recommendations to the board for moving forward. This is all a part of LCMC 3.0.

The part of LCMC 3.0 that is of interest to the Augustana District has to do with two recommendations that came from the consultant:

1) Regional development and 2) the articulation of common theological language. LCMC 3.0 imagines a future where groups of congregations are held together by region and common ministry endeavors. Currently, LCMC is largely perceived as individual and independent congregations held together by

a Constitution, Statement of Faith and our Name, Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ.

What if groups of congregations or districts or fellowship were more intentional and mutual ministry interests and made themselves accountable to one another? A primary duty of the New Service Coordinator will be to facilitate this move. Along with this, the question is being asked, "Is it time for LCMC to be more specific about "Lutheran distinctives?" In other words, what would it look like to articulate Lutheran commitments? In naming these, how does this help Christian witness in the context of our culture.

As a non-geographic district of LCMC, Augustana has and continues to regionally connect around a common commitment and purpose with the focus on Theology. Church. Mission. LCMC 3.0 imagines that the future of the association will emphasize something similar in future years, namely, regional connections among congregations around theological commitments that serve the Great Commission.

Mission Moment

I greet you in the name of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord!

On behalf of the members of the Augustana District Board of World Missions, I want to give you an update of how we are trying to better define, for our member congregations and mission minded individuals, which mission organizations we encourage and/or forward support.

The members of the Board of World Missions are a diverse group, with a least one member coming from congregations out of Illinois, Minnesota, New York, South Dakota, Texas, and Washington. Thus, like most Augustana District Boards and task forces, we meet virtually to continue this broad intersection of dedicated members.

Within our last two meetings we have taken a hard look at the "Vetted" ministries that appear on the Augustana District Website, as being worthy recipients of direct or directed support from our congregations. To this end, we will be updating the website to reflect two categories of Missions: Key District Mission Partners and Vetted Mission Organizations.

Key District Mission Partners will include those that we have worked with in establishing procedures and accountability in financial pass-through.

Congregations can feel secure that every dollar given through the District to a designated key partner will be sent in direct support. We currently have three such Key Partners: Tabor Evangelists Project (Hawassa, Ethiopia), North Central Ethiopian Synod, and All India Mashini Jamat.

Vetted Mission Organizations are those that have at the heart of their mission the preaching of the Gospel. These organizations will have gone through a vetting process by the Board for World Missions, so that we can feel confident in recommending that congregations consider them as worthy partners in mission. Many of these Vetted Mission Organizations have key individuals within the Augustana District that could be "local" contacts for learning how to best partner with these Vetted Mission Organizations.

So, watch the website for changes to reflect the two above categories, prayerfully consider, and then make plans in how we can together "preach the Word" to all nations!

PRAYER REQUEST

Due to the recent flooding in two states in India, Assam and Bihar, believers have been severely affected. Please pray for Assam and Bihar.

Assam: In Assam there are 30 districts in which approximately 400,000 people are affected. About 280 believer families have been staying in roadside tents for two and half months.



₱ Bihar: In Bahar there are 10 districts, with approximately 230,000 people affected due to the recent flood, especially three districts namely: Samastipur, Muzaffarpur, and West Champaran. Muzaffarpur district has had from 1-3 feet of water. Moreover approximately 230 believers' families have been affected by floods.

The Augustana District continues to look at a variety of ways to support churches. One way is to help congregations and clergy find reasonably priced health insurance for pastors and church staff. Augustana


