The Key

"[Jesus spoke, saying,] 'Fear not, I am the first and the last, and the living one; I died and behold I am alive for evermore, and I have the keys of Death and Hades.'" [Revelation 1:17b-18]

We have a lot of keys, and it indicates a need for locking things up.

Some people have one car and others have several, but they all need to be "secured". It used to be what you were most concerned with was losing the vehicle. Nowadays, it is more pressing to keep your data within the vehicle from being pilfered. Either way, security is increasingly difficult to keep up with for cars, boats, and trucks. (Not to mention computer and phone hacking, or theft of your home's title...) Yikes! These are all things that are important to you; perhaps you would even cite them as "vital."

Locks and keys have long been a part of security for people. In the book of Judges, Eglon, king of Moab, had locks on his doors. City gates could be sealed, so those miscreants with evil intent would be at least slowed down. Ehud got in to Eglon to slay him anyway, and then secured the roof chamber behind him.

Locks, and other security measures are for the good of things and protection of life and livelihood. Did Jesus ever have to worry about such things? Jesus lived and dwelt among us, but when he died the soldiers were casting lots for his clothes. It was all he had. Consider how much stuff we truly need, compared to Jesus' scant demands. We hardly know what it is to live such a lifestyle, so we get to learn about locking up things.

What do you most wish you could lock up? Many of our most prized possessions are relationships, and not stuff. Can you lock people up with you, and still have them love you? Not in my world, and not in yours either. Such imprisonment would not generate affection, but disdain and contempt.

Jesus does not offer his love and our future with him as an eternal cloister of one, just for you. God does not treat you as a brutal lover, chaining you to Him in compulsory salvation. You can forego His invitation, and take what is behind the curtain that is without Him.

To spurn the invitation of the King of Love is to invite an eternal solitary existence. If hell were not real and eternal, why would Christ Jesus bring it up at all? It is for your good and mine, not as a threat but as a reality.

Jesus Himself is the Key to lift you from your self-centered realm and bring you safely to Him. His proof is in the

forgiveness He has already given for all your sins, paid for in advance.

All India Masihi Jamat (AIMJ) Ministry Report

Through the AIMJ ministry in July, 177 people were baptized, 228 seekers participated in camps that introduced Jesus Christ, 182 women attended fellowship meetings, a total of 104 youths studied in six separate gatherings, and 367 children were taught Bible messages in three different programs.

Aafreen Quareshi, Bankura, West Bengal

I am Aafreen Quareshi. I come from an orthodox Muslim family. I have been taught the teachings of Quran and the teachings of Islam since I [was a] little kid. While I was studying in college, I made a friend who was a Muslim but got some literature regarding Christianity. He told me to read the books as they told about Jesus from Quran. The books were: *Sin and*Atonement in Islam and Christianity, Do

you know God's salvation is ready for you

and What do you think about Jesus Christ? I took the books and began reading them. I found it very interesting to read. So I continued reading the books but could not understand a lot of things and that is when I called brother Seikh Tanmoy whose number was inside the book. He was once a Muslim like me but he told me that he left Islam because he found the real truth. He would meet with me 2-3 times a week outside my college to clarify my doubts. This happened during the final semester of college and after that I was married. I told about my new faith to my wife and asked her if she was interested. She felt that I had joined a cult but

after reading those books for the next 7 months, she

too started to have little faith in Christ. We cleared our doubts with brother Seikh Tanmoy and

also began reading Bible. Some of the verses which we liked are - Matthew 28:11 "While the women were on their way, some of the guards went into the city and reported to the chief priests everything that had happened" and Acts 4:12 - "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved."

Our faith in Christ grew more and more and we accepted Christ by April 2020. Our parents and family came to know about our faith. They criticized us and even threatened us. But our faith was stronger than any of their threats. By God's grace nothing happened and as our faith grew more and so we decided to be baptized on 23 June 2021 and started our new life. We were baptized by Pr. S.K Jana because brother Seikh Tanmoy was infected by Covid-19. Please pray so that we could become the living testaments of our Lord's work and also bring our families to Christ. Also, pray for the healthy recovery of brother Seikh Tanmoy.

The battle is between the present national government led by its Christian Prime

Our partners on the ground strongly disagree and support their government.

Presently, the forces from Tigray are striking out at their perceived enemies in an area where one of our


mission partners, the North Central Ethiopia Synod of EECMY, has many congregations.

Seeking to flee bloodshed, people of this area, including pastors, are fleeing to the city of Dessie in desperation. Villages have been destroyed, rapes and killings of many are occurring.

Pastor Wagnew Andagre, president of the NCES, is seeking with others to reach out to their people with basic survival needs and spiritual encouragement. They are inviting us to respond, as our Lord leads. As you pray, pray for our Augustana District, its congregations, and leaders. Pray that we will discern how we may stand with our brothers and sisters in Christ in this hour of great need.

Pastors and Congregations,

I ask that you please forward this information to your respective council presidents.

There are currently LCMC congregations, and congregations desiring to transition to LCMC, who have reached out to us looking for pastoral support, direction, and encouragement. This presents us with a great opportunity to serve our brothers and sisters.

I am hoping that you, and your respective church councils, would be part of a plan to support these congregations (many without pastors). The main concern is pulpit supply, but also some pastoral coverage and transitional ministry needs. Each situation presents a different challenge, and I would be willing to help discern the particular needs for each one. There are both short-term and long-term needs. The first step in helping is to see who might be available.

The Word of God needs to be heard and proclaimed in the many pulpits that are empty. Just as our congregation's support mission and outreach through our local ministries, could the extension of pastoral staff and other resources also be a part of a new outreach? This would require coordination, but first we need conversation and mutual agreements between pastors and councils.

We are looking at a two-prong approach (one short-term and one long-term goal):

- Agreement and willingness to provide pastoral leadership and support to congregations who request it.
- Train, encourage and support lay preachers within your respective congregations who could also assist with long term needs. The vision would be to develop pastoral teams (pastors and lay persons) who would be available for longer term transitional and/or interim ministry support.

In whatever timely way is possible, could you please contact me and indicate how you and your congregation might be willing to serve (occasional pulpit supply, resources/support, pastoral coverage, congregational prayer partner). Let me know of any questions or concerns you or your council may have.

Again, this kind of ministry and outreach remains an emerging one for LCMC and the Augustana District. Thank you!


