Devotional

"The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it." John 1:5

I suppose there is something especially fitting about Advent for those of us who live far up in the northern hemisphere. As the days grow shorter and shorter and the nights longer and longer, we become more acutely aware of the gift of light. We prepare for Christmas, the celebration of Christ's entry into the world, in the darkest time of the year. For the second year in a row, we are making those preparations with a darkness and dread hanging over us. While writing this I received word that the local production of Joseph and the Amazing Technicolor Dreamcoat has been postponed due to a surge in covid cases. What we had all hoped was behind us seems determined to hang around.

Right in the middle of this season of deep darkness, we celebrate the coming of the light. We give thanks that the Word became flesh and chose to live among us. We rejoice that the true light has shone through the darkness. It is in this season of darkness that we see most clearly our need for this light. It is in this season of darkness that all the shadows cast by sin and death show us most clearly who we really are, what our situation really is.

And it is precisely because of the reality of our situation that the Word became flesh and dwelt among us. It is precisely because of the darkness that surrounds and fills us that God has shown his light. God would not allow the darkness of sin to overcome the light of Christ. Even as his light sunk below the horizon at the cross, even when all seemed lost, even when there was no more reason to think something good could come, even then, the power of God was bringing light out of darkness, life out of death. The true Light went straight into the valley of death and came out the other side even brighter than before.

This is the light that shines in the darkness. It is the only true light. It is the only light that reveals our true nature and makes us new people. It is the only light that has the power to overcome darkness once and for all. This is the light whose birth we are preparing to celebrate and the work he began in taking on flesh and continued in his taking on death and completed in his rising will never be undone. The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it. The darkness never will overcome it.

Mission Minute

Mission Minute: Young Adult Missionary Internship (YAMI)

Awakening Lives to World Missions (www.alwm.org) jackets or sweatshirts are usually enough to keep warm. exists to call, mobilize, equip, and network congregations to GROW LOCALLY and to GO GLOBALLY, personally responding to Jesus' command to make disciples in your "Jerusalem" and to 'the ends of the earth.' (Matt 28:18-20, Acts 1:8)

Over the last few years, ALWM, a mission partner of the Augustana District, and LCMC Pastor Matt Shields have been developing a program for young adults (ages 18-25) to experience life in a cross-cultural setting that would be longer than the typical 10-14 day "mission trip." The program, called Young Adult Missionary Internship (YAMI), would allow young adults to have a more indepth experience of what life is like in another culture over the course of 6-8 weeks.

Pastor Matt Shields and ALWM have partnered with the Bible Institute of South Africa, located just outside of Cape Town, to offer young adults a safe environment to stay in while visiting South Africa, as well as excellent opportunities to learn about and experience Christian ministry in another culture. For example, during the southern hemisphere "winter" term in July, the Bible Institute holds a one-week intensive course on engaging Islam. During that week, the students not only have inclass lectures, but also take trips to local mosques and other important sites. The young adults participating in the YAMI program participate in that class and join the various trips into the community. Even though it is winter in South Africa in July, it's not that cold, light

COVID restrictions around the world still make international travel difficult and uncertain. For the summer of 2022, ALWM will be taking a shorter trip. This trip will have a similar focus of "cultural immersion." Pastor Matt will take a group over to South Africa for two weeks. The first week of that trip will be planned to coincide with the Bible Institute's "winter" term in July. During that week, the young adults will participate in the class on engaging Islam. When time allows, Pastor Matt will take the group around to important cultural and national sites in the Cape Town area. The second week the group will leave the Bible Institute and travel around the country and even go on a true African Safari!

We are an 8+ month old Church Plant that bloomed during the pandemic - and God has been at work reaching people of all ages, all stages, all seasons, craving Jesus, law & gospel, and a no strings attached faith community/church home.

Meeting people where they are. Jesus in their junk. Light in the Darkness. Beauty in the Brokenness.



We started gathering for worship on Thursday evenings at Shenanigans Sports Bar and Grill. Sitting around tables, sharing a meal, and doing life together. We witnessed walls coming down and relationships being formed. People show up. Gather. Carrying life's burdens and the week's stress. They are met with the freeing, filling Good Word. FOR THEM. And a community to do life with. Our Thursday tables were filling up, so in August we added a Sunday morning worship. (In the sports bar dining room before they are open for the day. Their staff make us coffee and worship with us. They have become family. It is incredible!) We are hearing story after story about the space we've created - people getting fed, people getting freed, people hearing Jesus FOR THEM. Barriers have been broken down. Meals have been eaten together. Stories and tears have been shared. Around tables. Together. A little over eight months ago a pastor walked into a bar... and although it sounds like the start of a cheesy joke....everything that has grown, is happening, that God is doing in this place, is anything but a punch line!

Meet People Where They Are ...

- Worship on Thursday nights and Sunday mornings at the bar continues to fill the tables we are reaching people of all ages. We have added ways for people to learn across the generations, around the tables, with our children, youth, people of all ages/stages/seasons.
- Our group has had multiple opportunities to serve our community; we served a meal at our local "soup kitchen," worshiped with the clients/staff at a local treatment center, our families have had BINGO nights with the families at the local homeless shelter, the youth worshiped at the local Union Gospel Mission and collected food for the city's food pantry. The Table is walking with a local, lower income elementary school and has helped support the staff and students. The Christmas season will see Shenanigans Sports Bar team up with The Table to adopt families in our local foster care network.
- The Table popped up at parks this summer offering education/fellowship/engagement/ worship for kids-teens-families-individuals.
- C3 People spend their summers at the lake ... so that's where we went! Worship at the Lake we spent a Sunday worshiping through music and a message at a local "hot spot" for camping and summer vacationing at a local lake.

What a wild ride! A crazy, beautiful one!

One of the goals of our new leadership board is to help everyone get acquainted with the AD WOW.



2021 Augustana District Annual Report for Congregations "SENT ONES"

Usually Annual Reports are meant to recount the changes, progress and challenges of the year past. Along with that, they might highlight some new things coming. In a time when there seems to be so many changes and challenges (in the church and in the culture), I thought it best to highlight the one thing that remains the same and unites us all.

One of the speakers at the LCMC Annual Gathering lifted this up in a simple and profound way. He said, "We are simply messengers of the one message that does not change." This has important implications. The Lord has given us this treasure, the gospel, of which we are merely the messengers. Jesus doesn't need us to dress it up or spice it up. It is arrogant of us to think we could or should change the message. It is HIS message, not ours. This message does not need our humor or winsome personalities to be heard. It needs a messenger. The message will not return empty, but will accomplish that for which it is sent (Isaiah 55:11).

I'm reminded of a simple poem by Gerhard Frost called, "The Sent One." Frost recalls being a young child sent to the grocery store by his mother with a grocery list. How good it felt to be sent by another. How wonderful to know that in his little hand was an important and urgent message. How good it was to see how the message he held was soon put into action when received by another.

The Augustana District is made up of many different congregations, with many different histories and challenges and trials. This diversity is held together by one thing. We are "sent ones" who have been given the same message. This seems to be the most important thing to note at year end. Our challenges and accomplishments are recorded on our website and in monthly newsletter, it all reflects the same thing, times change, culture changes, challenges change. This 2021 Annual Report is actually much like last year's report, as well as all the years previous to this one. It is best summarized by St. Paul in 2 Corinthians 5:20:

"Therefore, we are ambassadors for Christ, God making his appeal through us."

I give thanks to all of you through whom God is making his appeal. What an honor to be "sent ones" of this message of love and grace.






