THE MYSTERIES OF GOD REVEALED

Devotional

There are deep mysteries of God that will not be revealed on this side of the grave. There are things about God that humans cannot and will not know. This is one thing that distinguishes us from God. However, God has not left us in the dark. There is much we can and do know. It is enough. Primarily, we have the clear Word of God, Jesus Christ. Jesus Christ reveals all we need to know about who God is. And from this, we derive all kinds of analogies from human relationships. There are examples from nature, like seed time and harvest, the miracle of life itself, our amazing brains, the human body, human blood, etc. It is this last one that has recently captured my attention.

In August, my sister was diagnosed with acute myeloid leukemia (AML). She is engaged in an internal war between cancerous leukemia cells and toxic chemotherapy. Recently, we discovered that I was a perfect match as a stem cell donor. This is not all that common. Thanks be to God! This discovery led her to go for the cure instead of hoping for remission. All of this has led me down a trail of reviewing some biology, my college major. I don't intend to put you down that same path and discuss the role of bone marrow, hematopoietic stem cells, red and white blood cells and platelets through this devotion. However, there are some theological analogies that apply as I think about the complexities and power and mystery of human blood. There is a connection one can make to our Lord's shed blood. On the day of transplant, my sister will be both passive and defenseless. Newly created stem cells will rush into her body and find their way to her bone marrow. By God's power and grace, life will be restored.

As I think of the wonder of this, it occurs to me that we are all like a passive and defenseless stem cell recipient. We wait for our Lord, His body and blood, to rush into our very bodies to meet us at the points of our deepest need. And what does He bring as he rushes in? He brings the forgiveness of sins, and where there is the forgiveness of sins, there is life and salvation.

That ought to be enough mystery, clearly revealed, to sustain us and give us life until that day when all mysteries are revealed. In Christ,

Mission Minute Tom T. on Myanmar

On behalf of the Lutheran Church of Myanmar, we are thankful for all your prayers during the past six months. With a Military Coup and the struggles of COVID19, it has been a year of challenges. One of the LCM's church members live in the area where the tension between the Military and People Defense Force (PDF) are high. Ethnic Arms group are also helping the PDF and many people had to leave the area and take refuge in border areas. It is safe in the Yangon City, but church leaders have to be careful going out for work or getting supplies.

In addition, the security of local people is more and more at risk as the war between the military soldiers and PDF is more intense in many different parts of the country including major cities. The PDF recently announced not to use the national highways from Yangon to Mandalay, Bago and other states. And for emergencies, put a white flag on the car so that they will know the civilians are aboard, or else they won't take the security of the car. Rev. Martin's cousin, who is from Falam township, Chin state, passed away in Yangon and the family tried to take her back to her home village. But their car landed on landmines twice on the way and couldn't continue their trip so they had to bury her at the town nearby where they had the car accident.

The challenges facing the Lutheran Church of Myanmar during this time is something we here in the U.S.A. are not use to during our daily life. So please keep them all in your prayers. Small Acts of Faith

"What shall we say the kingdom of God is like, or what parable shall we use to describe it? It is like a mustard seed, which is the smallest of all seeds on earth. Yet when planted, it grows and becomes the largest of all garden plants, with such big branches that the birds can perch in its shade." Mark 4:30–32 NIV

Today, on a cold day in late winter, I acted on faith by planting poppies. While it's way too early to plant anything else, this is prime planting time for poppies. The seeds are tiny—like the poppy seeds you'd find on a bakery roll.

If I hadn't seen it happen every year, I'd find it hard to believe that by late June, those tiny seeds will become bright pink puffy flowers the size of my fist, blooming on stalks two feet tall or more. I harvested these seeds last year from plants. I've done this for years, starting with some seeds given me by gardening mentors.

To plant poppies requires faith. And action. You simply scatter them on the soil (in some years, I've put them right on top of snow). The seeds need cold to germinate, so I'm hoping I haven't planted too late. Optimally, I should have planted them last month. But if I leave them in the plastic bag on the shelf, they'll never be flowers. They'll just be good intentions.

Jesus often used seeds as a picture of the kingdom of heaven. He was not talking about a someday, somewhere-else kingdom, but rather, a present reality. Even when it's still winter, I trust spring will come. I trust God will provide, and help the seeds I'm planting to bloom. He'll take my small acts of faith, and grow them into something beautiful.

Faith Step: What seeds do you need to plant today, even if you are skeptical that they will ever result in beauty or fruit?
