Devotion

"For God has done what the law, weakened by the flesh, could not do..." Romans 8:3a

For as long as I've known anything about God I've known I was saved by faith, not works. I learned it at home. I learned it in Sunday School and Confirmation. I learned it in worship. It's been the beating heart at the center of everything I've ever believed.... at least in theory. It's what I know I'm supposed to say. It's what I preach and teach. It's what I confess.

But in my heart of hearts, where the old sinner is alive and well, I have always wanted to be righteous under the law. I've always wanted to get things right – make the right choices, do the right thing, be the right way. Far from being unleashed to sin boldly, the promise that has shaped my life has made me want to be worthy of it. But the law doesn't work that way. It never declares you worthy, only unworthy.

For the past month or so my parents have both been dealing with significant health issues. Neither can really be left unattended for very long at the moment. Wanting to be a good daughter according to the fourth commandment, I have been trying to help out. One day mom had a doctor's appointment, so I loaded them both up in the car and off we went. When we got there, they told us that mom needed to go to the lab, down the hall and to the right. So we started heading that direction, with mom using dad's walker and dad using his cane. We got to the hall that led to the lab and dad announced he had to use the bathroom. So he kept going straight ahead to the restrooms and mom took off down the hall toward the lab.

And I, the good daughter who would be righteous under the law, stood there watching them both go, trying to do a quick mental calculation of which one was least likely to fall or get lost along the way. It was a moment of utter defeat. There was no way to honor both father and mother, so I had to pick. Suddenly the absolute futility of my efforts became crystal clear to me. This is not a game I'm going to win.

In that same moment of utter defeat, the promise that has been the beating heart of my faith was no longer an abstraction. There was no way I was going to get this right, but another has already defeated the death I am working so hard to postpone.

God in Jesus Christ has done what the law could not do. That's not a theological abstraction. It's not a nice religious turn of phrase. It's not a doctrinal position. It is our only hope. It is the light in our deepest darkness. It is the life that is being brought out of the death that is all around, and it is most certainly true.

Tragedy and Good News Mixed Together: News from the Front Lines of Witness PRESIDENT WAGNEW ANDAGRE OF THE NORTH CENTRAL ETHIOPIA SYNOD (NCES)



The Augustana District through one of its congregations, Living Word, in Moses Lake, WA., supports a major training program for pastors and evangelists of the NCES. President Wagnew leads this effort and recently shared both experiences of tragedy and wonderful news of the

Good News of Jesus Christ breaking through in heartwarming ways.

Tragedy has struck in a horrific expression of hatred. The NCES with its congregations is in the Amharic region of the country, the largest tribal area in the country. Due to a major drought 30 some years ago a large number of people from Amhara fled to another predominant tribal area, Oromo. In recent months about 700 of these Amharic people were attacked by a renegade group from Oromo and massacred. Hatred too often runs deep and strikes out in evil ways.

More recently one of the trainees of President. Wagnew planted a congregation in a very troubled area. Things were going well, but then he was stoned three times for his efforts, the last one leaving him near death. Some of our brothers and sisters, bearing witness to the good news of Jesus Christ that receive our support, pay with their lives for proclaiming that Good News.

On a more uplifting note, President Wagnew reported that 30 Muslims were recently baptized. Four of them came from a 99% Muslim area, which has been very hostile to Christian witness.

Great darkness at times is overcome by the Light of Christ shining in that darkness. That Light we believe in will not be overcome by the dark, demonic powers of the evil one. Thanks be to God.

Women of the Word

The annual gathering of the Women of the Word was held at the New Hope Lutheran Church in Comfrey, Minnesota, on Saturday, September 17. There were 66 women in attendance from 22 churches across the synod as well as members from four churches that joined via Zoom.

The theme for the gathering this year was "Ministry Through Music" and was carried out through the decorations, music and speakers. Throughout the day, the theme verse, "Serve the Lord with gladness. Come into his presence with singing" (Psalm 100:2) was continually reinforced.

"Soul's Inspiration," a group of singers from the church, started the day with a beautiful hymn sing. The group was accompanied by organist, Laurie Fredin, and Pastor Patricia Baglien on the guitar. Pastor Patricia had served the church in the late 1990's at which time the church was destroyed by a tornado. Pastor Patricia was instrumental in organizing the "Soul's Inspiration" group.

The Communion service was led by Pastor John Hopper of New Hope Lutheran. During the service we were privileged to watch a video of his granddaughter, Lauren Hopper, playing and singing a song she had written, based on Psalm 46, which she had entitled "Be Still and Know That I Am God." She shared how she wrote this song during a difficult time in her life. The speakers for the day were Pastor Diane Oderman and Pastor Patricia Baglien. Both women shared inspiring thoughts on singing and music that has been important throughout the centuries in worship services. Pastor Patricia played the guitar and sang original songs during her presentation.

The offering for the day was designated for Samaritan Purse ~ Operation Christmas Child. Items were also donated for the OCC Shoebox program and a very large wooden box filled with those donations. The shoeboxes will be filled by members of New Hope Lutheran when they work with their community to fill many shoeboxes for this project. They packed 143 boxes last year and with these additional generous donations they hope to fill more this year.


