THE GOD IN THE STORM

In the dark days of Germany during World War II, a German pastor's home was destroyed by the Allied bombing campaign. Even though he opposed Hitler's Third Reich, there was no way for the highaltitude bombers to know that, so he too felt the nightly terror of the falling bombs. He and his family took shelter away from the ruined city in a rural farming village. One night, as he walked through the peaceful streets of the little hamlet, he noticed how everything was so peaceful there. It was as ideal as he had imagined it could be - cows on the hills, people talking about the upcoming harvest, cozy lights peeking out between the curtains of the houses. It was completely different from the world he had just come from.

However, and much to his surprise, was the unexpected lack of peace he felt inside himself. What he experienced was an inner turmoil, and a feeling that he didn't belong there. He wrote this,

"In the next few days, it drove me back to the ruined city and the people whose faces were still marked by the terror of the bombings. Oddly, it was here where I felt at home. These people understood what I had gone through because they had suffered it themselves. The people of the village did not understand me. To them I was a disquieting apparition from another frightening world. There is nothing more comforting than to have people who understand who you are and what you have been through..."

(Helmut Thielicke, Christ and the Meaning of Life)

As a Christian who faces the storms and troubles of life, I can take comfort and courage from a Savior who came into my world, experienced its troubles, and who understands my storms. He is my Friend in the storm. He not only has the compassion, but also the power to help me. I'm not alone and I'm not cut off from help.

It's like the story of Jesus calming the storm in Mark 4. A number of things pop out at us in this account: first, it was Jesus' idea to get in the boat that day; and second, the storm produced this fear driven rebuke of Jesus from His disciples, "Teacher, do you not care that we are perishing?"


I can relate to this! Many times, my storms make me forget who God is, because of what I fear. I can actually make an idol out of any storm by forgetting that along with the storm, the Lord gives me the gift of Himself. Like the disciples, I too forget that He is in the boat with me, in the storm! And who He is makes all the difference in the world! First, by His incarnation, He is a Man who understands my suffering; He's been there. Second, as the Son of God, He is the almighty God who has the power to speak peace into my storm; He is my Rock and Fortress. And finally, as my God-Man Savior, Jesus has conquered the storm's power to condemn me – for by His death on the cross for my sins, He has removed any barrier between God and myself. In Him, I now live beneath an open heaven, in Him God relates to me ONLY from His love for me.

Though I may be tempted to interpret my storms as God's judgment, God points me to Jesus' death upon the cross for me and assures me that His judgment for my sin is completely and forever satisfied! As He promises in Romans 8:1, "There is no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus."

As we encounter the storms in this life, may God grant us faith to see that He is in the boat with us as our Friend and our Savior. May we hear His words, "Peace, be still." Float our boats dear Lord! Give us Your peace. To God be the glory!

Financial update

Mission Minute: South African Cultural Immersion Trip For Young Adults

In July of 2023 Awakening Lives to World Missions (ALWM) will be hosting a two-week cross-cultural immersion trip for young adults (18-25) in the Republic of South Africa. This trip will be led by Pastor Matt Shields (LCMC and AD certified).

While many mission trips focus on service projects, this trip will be different. Traveling to another country can be a truly eye-opening experience that can help a person grow and see the world differently. This trip is focused on providing young adults an opportunity to learn about and experience the culture of South Africa through indepth experiences.

The first week of the trip will be a road trip that begins in the city of Johannesburg and finishes in Cape Town. Along the way, the group will visit important cultural sites, such as the Apartheid Museum, as well as fun excursions, like a drive through Addo Elephant National Park. This road trip will provide a glimpse of the vast beauty and diversity of the country of South Africa. The second week will be centered in the city and surrounding areas of Cape Town. ALWM has partnered with the Bible Institute of South Africa in the city of Kalk Bay where the groups will stay for the week. Through this partnership with BISA the young adults will be set up in a "home stay" for a few nights where they will get a truly personal and intimate experience of life in South Africa. During the "home stay" the young adults will have to live just like their host family.

Pastor Matt has several years of experience living and working in South Africa, including helping to plant a church in the northern Limpopo region. He is excited to share his missions experience with young adults and help guide them as they process what they will learn about and be exposed to. This trip is part of the ministry of ALWM, an Augustana District vetted mission organization led by Rev. Bill Moberly.

Dr. Robert Kolb is an emeritus professor of systematic theology at Concordia Seminary, Saint Louis, the co-editor with Timothy Wengert of the translation of The Book of Concord (Fortress Press 2000) and the author of

several books on Luther and on the Lutheran confessions, including *Martin Luther and the Enduring Word of God. The Wittenberg School and its Scripture-Centered Proclamation* (Grand Rapids: Baker Academic, 2016) and *Luther's Treatise On Christian Freedom and Its Legacy* (Lanham, MD: Fortress Academic/Lexington, 2019).

Professor Steven Paulson has been teaching and preaching for over thirty years and is chair of Lutheran Theology at LHOS. He holds degrees in theology from St. Olaf College, the Master

of Divinity from Luther Seminary and the Theological Doctorate from the Lutheran School of Theology in Chicago. He has taught at Concordia College, Moorhead, and Luther Seminary, St. Paul, before coming to Sioux Falls. He is the author of many books and articles, including Luther's Outlaw God, Volume 1 and 2.

What does God have in store for us as leaders of the Augustana Women of the Word? First, just a quick reminder that if your congregation belongs to the Lutheran Church in Mission for Christ (LCMC) Augustana District, and you are a woman, you are a member of the AD WOW.

Now, I would like to ask you to ponder, "What is the future of WOW?"

We don't know the future, but we do know and trust who holds the future. We know that women will continue to be active and doing God's will in our congregations. Here are some ideas and suggestions to help you have a positive impact: & Read and study the Bible personally and together.

Hear the word preached at worship.
Think about how you can witness.
How can you continue to learn and grow after

confirmation? Confirmation classes are not the graduation' point – they are an affirmation of baptism, which is daily renewed.

- Embrace means of gathering and studying with new technology – perhaps a zoom Bible Study that meets later in the evening.
- Lastly, enable your church to have a healing, spiritual ministry – one that encourages witnessing, prayer, and salvation.

And, finally, I would ask you, on behalf of the AD WOW leaders: "How can we (as the AD WOW leaders) support and encourage your local women's groups?"

We would love to hear from you! A listing of the current AD WOW officers follows this article. Being a Christian gives us so much joy. As Christians and WOW let's come together and spread the Lord's spirit. We may not see immediate results, but we must put our best foot forward through Bible reading and active response, God will do the rest. Thank you for sharing the Gospel. "Go spread the word."
