### Devotional

Psalm 40

"I waited patiently for the Lord; he inclined to me and heard my cry."

<sup>2</sup>He drew me up from the desolate pit, out of the miry bog, and set my feet upon a rock, making my steps secure. <sup>3</sup>He put a new song in my mouth, a song of praise to our God. Many will see and fear, and put their trust in the Lord. <sup>4</sup>Happy are those who make the Lord their trust, who do not turn to the proud, to those who go astray after false gods.

"I waited patiently..." "Happy are those who make the Lord their trust..." Does this sound like you? Do you wait "patiently for the Lord?" Is your trust in the Lord alone? Maybe the answer is both yes and no. Yes, you wait upon the Lord (it's not like you can hurry him anyway) and yes, you trust God. In the words of Dr. Suess, "except when you don't, because sometimes you won't." Sometimes we are too impatient to wait on God to move, sometimes we trust ourselves or even someone else more than we trust the Creator and Sustainer of all things seen and unseen. Let's face it, we tend to be a fickle lot.

The good news, the Great News, is that God doesn't depend upon our patience or our trust for him to act in our defense. The psalmist said that he waited patiently. He waited. He did not set out to fix everything, he waited. He waited and he cried out to God. What did God do? God, drew him up from the pit, set his feet on solid ground, made his steps secure, put a song in his mouth. God was busy in all this. The psalmist was patient and cried out, but God drew, set, made, and put. One waited and cried; the Other was on the move. God moved to deliver his child and moved so that many others would see and trust God. In God's saving moments, he was not just saving one, but many.

Does this sound like God? Does it sound like One in whom you can trust? For whom you can wait patiently? Most of us struggle with patience and trusting God. The Good News is that God doesn't struggle with you. He became the sacrificial lamb to save you, and he will continue to pull you up from the pit and out of the miry bog. He will set your feet on solid ground and make your steps secure. He will put a song of praise in your heart.

Even in our distrusting impatience, God saves. What a God we have!

### Mission Minute: All India Masihi Jamat (AIMJ) Ministry Report

In December the pastors of AIMJ baptized 68 people. They held baptism, seekers, women's, youth, and children's camps. Among four meetings 841 women attended, 2,331 total youth attended among nine camps, and 164 children attended camps during December. God continues to spread his word in India!

'I am Seikh Akbar Hossain. I used to serve in the Indian Army, serving there for 30 years, retiring a few years ago. We don't come from a big orthodox Muslim family but the faith of everyone in my family was always strong. I got some literature from Brother Jahurul Islam who met me at a tea stall. We were talking about Islam and Christianity and that is when I got to know about

Jesus and the love that God has for us. The books were - Did God appear in the flesh? and What do you think about Jesus Christ? Out of curiosity I began reading the books and read for the next 11 months. After reading the books I thought that the teachings given by Jesus and His life are the truth and the teachings in Islam are not true. Brother

Jahurul came to my house once or twice a week to clarify my doubts.

After reading the books I began to believe in Jesus. So, Brother Jahurul gave me a Bible and asked us to join him in his Sunday service every week. I began reading the Bible and also joined the Sunday fellowship.



The Bible verse which we liked the most is Acts 4:12 "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given to mankind by which we must be saved." Slowly, after some time, my faith in Christ grew more and I accepted Christ in January 2017. My neighbors, relatives and people in the village came to know about our faith

and they criticized me and began hating me. But all this criticism and hate never stopped my faith and it just increased every day. On December 11, 2022 I was baptized. Please pray that my children would also continue to grow in their faith and be baptized.


#### RENEWING THE LOCAL CHURCH


