"Let your conversation be always full of grace, seasoned with salt, so that you may know how to answer everyone." _ Colossians 4:6

As I write this article, I'm looking around my office at all the mementos that have been gifted to me over the years by thoughtful parishioners. October is, after all, Pastor's Appreciation Month, and many of us who are blessed to serve as clergy will be showered in the coming weeks with heartfelt cards, keepsakes, or maybe even the occasional Starbucks gift card. (It is Pumpkin Spice Latte season, after all.)

And while the notes, wall hangings, and gift cards are appreciated, and while I'll be forever grateful that members of my fold take time to remember me, I truly wonder if there isn't something more Pastors are needing, not just in the month of October but all year long.

This letter the apostle Paul writes to the Christians living in Colossae is perhaps one of his shortest prison epistles, but the reason for his writing is predictable. As is always the case, descension has arisen in the church, seeking to divide the body of believers. There are disagreements festering over the worship of angels, human regulations concerning eating and drinking practices, and the dual nature of Christ as both man and God. And once Paul has removed these stumbling blocks that have been laid in their path, the final instruction he gives before the closing greeting is this: season your conversations with salt.

What might come as a shock to parishioner and Pastor alike is that descension, division and disagreements in the Church are nothing new. Paul was rarely five miles out of town and the Church he had just planted already had people at each other's throats. Sometimes discord and dissent within the body of Christ is over theology, while other times (and perhaps more commonly) it comes over optics, like carpet color or how people should be scheduled for their turn on the coffee fellowship rotation. Either way, Paul tells us to speak with salty grace.

Because without salt, a dish is incomplete. I am well acquainted with friends and family who are on low sodium diets, having to cook without salt, and they all speak in unison: it isn't the same; it misses the mark. Without grace, a conversation is incomplete. Without mercy, a conversation just isn't the same. Without patience and understanding, a conversation misses the mark.

So, perhaps this is what your Pastor might need this month; a little grace. Perhaps they might need you to interpret their words and actions in the best possible light, or in the kindest way. (See Luther's explanation on the Eighth Commandment.) Remember always that your congregation has called a Pastor into a holy vocation, but the Pastor themselves, including me, are no less broken than you. So, throw a little salt their way. And a Starbucks gift card wouldn't hurt either. Amen.




