# The Theological Conference Recap

#### The Heart of the Matter

The annual theological conference of the Augustana District, LCMC, was on February 5 and 6 at the Embassy Suites Airport Hilton hotel, under the title "The Heart of the Matter: Whose Will Be Done?"

As several of the speakers reminded us, Luther once remarked that after his death all of his works should be burned except the Small Catechism and his book on the Bondage of the Will. Our speakers also reminded us that our context is deeply mired in the notion of a free will. It can be a most difficult task for those of us who would be preachers of the Gospel to speak to ears tuned to the thinking of free will, but our speakers did an admirable job in clarifying and helping us with this matter.



The conference speakers were Rev. Dr. Marney Fritts of Maple Valley, WA; Rev. Dr. Ken Jones of Des Moines, IA; and Pastor Scott Grorud of Hutchinson, MN. The initial panel discussion with all of the speakers was moderated by Sarah Stenson who gave us a broad introduction to their presentations, offered for us to gain an appreciation for the wide range of impacts an improper understanding of the will can have in our time and culture. Dr. Fritts admirably presented the scriptural and confessional witness concerning our incurable condition of a will curved in upon itself in dire need of a redeemer – who is, of course. Jesus Christ our Lord. Dr. Jones followed up with this in terms of how the bound will in our cultural context is affecting college students, who are quite frankly exhausted and desperate to hear some other word which can set them free from the expectations and agendas of the free will advocates who insist all kinds of social ills can be addressed

and ameliorated if we just work harder. Oh, the bondage! Finally, Pastor Grorud gave us insights into practical matters of pastoral care to people who oftentimes seem to have no ears to hear a different word on the bondage of the will.

Rev. Randy Freund shared his plans to step down from his servant position as our district service coordinator. He will be missed. A process is beginning to determine what course our district will follow as we move on. Rev. Julie Smith also reported on her work with LCMC and how our district can assist the umbrella organization in furthering our mutual goals.

Further comments were heard about how much fun was had by people reconnecting with old friends and acquaintances, and making new connections during breaks, meals, and free times. This is an often overlooked positive outcome to a conference like ours.

Thanks to our vendors who were present, for the work they do and service they provide – Institute of Lutheran Theology (ILT), Luther House of Studies, and Sola Publishing. A unique event also occurred at this conference as Carolyn Nestingen came with boxes of Jim's books for us to claim for our own libraries. He is missed by us all.

All in all, it was a wonderful time of insight and fellowship, well worth my trip from Washington to attend, and I hope to do it all again next year, (unless Jesus returns first!)

# Mission Minute: Update

#### Greetings AD!

Last May, I had the opportunity to attend the AD District conference in person for the first time, after years of virtual participation. It was truly a thrilling experience for me, especially being present as the first Endorsed Missionary of AD. During the conference, I shared about God's calling for my family to return and serve in support of unreached people groups in Laos and parts of the Mekong region. I am pleased to announce that God has made what seemed unachievable, achievable, as we are preparing to move back to Laos in the upcoming summer of 2024.

God has graciously provided us with supportive partners to help us reach our goals so that we can return. While there will be some changes, I will continue to provide theological support and work on Bible translation for unreached groups. However, my focus will now shift from a regional impact to a global one. My family and I are still processing what this transition means for us, but we are genuinely excited about the opportunities that lie ahead in the coming months.

Nevertheless, we are in urgent need of launch funds to facilitate this transition. These funds will assist us in covering expenses such as flights, visas, moving costs, and other initial expenses crucial for our relocation. Our launch fund requires immediate support as we prepare for the upcoming months. Unfortunately, the slow response from many Lutheran churches is a

significant concern. Therefore, I kindly appeal not only to churches but also to individuals who may be interested in supporting our mission.




